From the Pastor

"But thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ."
(I Corinthians 15:57, NIV)

"Fail!" The word has become a comical byword, a way to humorously label our own unsuccessful efforts, sometimes even adding the exaggeration "EPIC fail!" While the use of such phrases may be innocent and often in good fun, it points to the ease with which accept and even expect our own failure. There is a prevalent sense that our shortcomings are the norm. Yes, we're all fallen beings. And yes, I am an advocate of cultivating a healthy sense of self-distrust and a humility that honestly recognizes our weaknesses. But as followers of Jesus, though fallen, we can look in faith to the One whose strength is made perfect in our weakness (2 Cor. 12:9).

The apostle Paul had no shortage of words in describing not just the moral depravity of humanity in general but also his own infirmities, speaking of himself as the "chief" of sinners (I Tim. I:15). Yet this same man could give the loudest of thanks because he knew God to be the One who "gives the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ" (I Cor. 15:57). Not just a victory or some victory, but **the** victory.

But exactly what victory can this chief of sinners rejoice in so much? In the context, the victory we're given is victory over death and the grave (I Cor. 15:54-55), the most formidable of foes known to humanity since our exit from the Garden of Eden. **That** victory is *given* to us, *handed* to us, made available to us through Jesus. And if you and I can claim victory over death itself, then shouldn't we be even more quick to give God thanks for victory over this shortcoming or that struggle? Habits, addictions, character flaws often seem insurmountable, but the One who gives us **the** victory over death assures us that "in all these things we are more than conquerors" (Rom. 8:37).
