From the Pastor

"I will instruct you and teach you in the way you should go."
Psalm 32:8, NKJV

Decisions, decisions. Life is full of them. There will always be forks in the road, a door #1 or door #2 to be reckoned with. It's comforting to know that we, in our finite human understanding, do not have to scheme and map out our own life journey. The Almighty, all-knowing God already has plans and purposes of His own There is none like God who knows the end from the beginning (Isa. 46:9-10), not just on the grand scale, but on the personal level as well. And when we are confident that God Himself has plans for us, this inspires us to seek Him with all our hearts (Jer. 29:11-13).

Some may feel as though God is "hands off" when it comes to the decisions we make in our personal lives. Granted, God may have a range of options that would be pleasing to Him in any given circumstance, but He promises to instruct and teach us in the way we "should go" (Psalm 32:8). Additionally, the apostle Paul urges us to understand what the Lord's will is so we can a) not be "fools," and b) redeem the time and rescue it from being wasted or lost (Eph. 5:15-17). No wonder David, the man after God's own heart (1 Sam. 13:14), habitually inquired of the Lord (at least 11 times in the Old Testament) and included it in the top priority of his life (Ps. 27:4).

What decisions are you faced with today? In your school, your work, your home? Regarding your finances, your relationships, your ministry? Let's make it our habit to take our concerns and anxious thoughts to the One who promises to make our paths straight (Prov. 3:5-6).

We may worry and fret over decisions, but we can let the Lord who direct our steps (Prov. 16:9). There may be times we make unwise decisions or trip up while attempting to follow God's lead, but praise

Grilled Lemon-Basil Tofu Burger

Ingredients:

I pound firm or extra firm tofu, pressed & sliced into 4 slices

Lemon Marinade:

1/3 cup finely chopped fresh basil 1/4 cup fresh lemon juice

- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 2 Tbsp Dijon mustard
- 2 Tbsp honey
- 1 Tbsp olive oil
- 2 tsp lemon rind
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 1/4 tsp red pepper

Olive Relish:

1/3 cup finely chopped pitted kalamata olives

- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 3 Tbsp vegan sour cream
- 3 Tbsp veganaise

Directions

In a small bowl, combine lemon marinade ingredients. Cut tofu crosswise into 4 or 5 slices. Place tofu slices on a sheet pan and brush both sides of tofu slices with lemon juice mixture; reserve remaining juice mixture. Let tofu rest I hour or more.

Preheat grill to a medium high heat. Place tofu slices on grill rack coated with cooking spray. Grill for about 4 minutes on each side. Brush tofu with the reserved juice mixture.

Olive relish is a great compliment to these tofu burgers. I also enjoy lettuce, tomato, and red onion slices.

Deeply disappointed, she understood that the Lord could have come in their lifetime! But His people did not surrender their thoughts and opinions to the leading of the Holy Spirit.
