From the Pastor

"Behold! The Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!"
(John 1:29, NKJV)

Have you ever gotten so wrapped up in a project or task that you actually had to remind yourself **why** you were doing what you were doing? In our individual lives, we have a tendency to allow our activity to become so consuming that we lose sight of the original reason and motivation for the activity itself. This may be innocent enough in the realm of daily routine and efficient task management. But in the experience of God's church, even while happily and efficiently accomplishing many things, losing sight of the WHY can be detrimental and deadly.

Question: What's our mission, motivation, purpose? What is the WHY that drives all we do as a church? The answer to that question, though simple, must continually be refreshed in our hearts and minds.

It does not take a rocket scientist to discern that the times in which we live are fraught with signs of spiritual darkness and decay. As the old song says, "if we ever needed the Lord before, we sure do need Him now." Ellen White stated it powerfully back in 1905: "The world needs today what it needed nineteen hundred years ago—a *revelation* of Christ" (*Ministry of Healing*, 143). The world needs to see the Savior.

To address that need two millennia ago, the Word became flesh and dwelt among us so we could see the glory of His character (Jn. 1:14). Yet today Jesus turns to us and calls you and I the "salt of the earth" and the "light of the world" (Matt. 5:13-16). In other words, our Lord charges us with the mission of fulfilling a dying world's need to see the Savior. And when sinners look to the Savior, we live (Jn. 3:14-16). That is God's mission for us, for you, for me.

CVCA WHAT CAN I DO

Often we are asked to support our church school (CVCA). How many times have you heard that plea and thought, how can I help, I barely have enough money to get to the end of the month. Let me tell you how you can help without spending one penny more than you presently spend and it may even help you stay on budget for the month.

If you buy groceries, gas, clothing, or pharmacy items, or occasionally eat out you can help. We have a scrip program at the school that is essentially gift cards, which you purchase from us and we get a percentage. So you buy a hundred dollar gift card from us for Home Depot, you get \$100 worth of product and we get \$4. Payless shoe source is 13% and See's Candy 20%. Groceries and gas tend to be lower percentages, but add up over time. Fast foods, Restaurants, Specialty Stores and clothing stores tend to be higher percentages. If you do not use all of the money on the card the balance remains on the card and in California there is no expiration date.

If you know a student at the school you can put their name on the order form and they will receive the credit. The student receives 4%, their classroom receives 3% and 3% is retained to support the program. If you do not have a particular student you would like to support then 7% is placed in the worthy student fund. The student then can use their credit for their school bill, class trips, such as Science Camp, History tour, band or choir tours, etc.

These cards are also great for birthday gifts, Christmas, etc. They save you time (you don't have to go shopping), insure the receiver gets the style color and size they like and they will be sure to enjoy their gift because it will be something they want.

If you would like to take part in the program there are order blanks on the front desk, fill one out and get it to me or call me and I will take your order over the phone. I will pick up your order at the school and you can pay on delivery. Most of the items on the list we have available at all times. You may also go directly to the school to make your purchases.
