Little Brian wanted to buy a special Christmas gift for his mother. His genuine, 8-years young heart eagerly searched his piggy bank and found it to be empty. "Mom," he endearingly calls. "May I have \$20, please?" "For what, dear?" his mother asks in surprise. "To buy your Christmas gift!"

It's a fitting parallel that portrays our inability and insufficiency to give to God anything that is originally our own. The truth is, anything we give to God has its beginnings in God Himself. What we offer Him is from the overflow of what He has given us. Our ability to give anything to God, like little Brian, is only made possible by what He has given to us.

In my younger years, my siblings and I would often learn and sing trios together. Around the holiday season, one of those songs asks a simple but significant question in its chorus:

What can I give to the King Give to the One who has everything What can I give, what gift can I bring? What can I give to the King?

Whatever our answer, whatever we give to the King, it should always be seen as a response to what God has first given to us: He has given His best, His all, His only begotten Son. So what can we return and render to God for all His goodness to us (Ps. 116:12-13)?

Give Him our first and best. Jesus defended and endorsed Mary Magdalene's act of worship when others criticized it as excessive and wasteful (Mark 14:6). Why? Because God really is deserving of our firsts, not just our lasts. He's the King who deserves our finest, not our leftovers (Mal. 1:8, 14). Let's be sure that whatever we offer Him — in priority, in profession, in possessions — is from the prime cut (Mt. 6:33; Prov. 3:9-10).

Give Him our little and least. This isn't a contradiction of the previous point, but it is meant to balance the reality that when we give God our first and best it doesn't always equate to what's flashy or grandiose. When we feel like our first and best won't make a drop in the bucket, that's not our cue to keep it from God. Just ask the widow who gave her two measly mites to the temple treasury (Lk. 21:4) and the lad who shared his little lunch to feed the multitudes (John 6:9). We should never settle for mediocrity when giving to God. But when we, or others around us, are tempted to question the value of our honest efforts or gifts, let's remember that a little becomes much in the Master's hands.

Give Him our all and whole. From the biggest to the smallest, and everything in between, God is deserving of it all because He has given His all. The apostle Paul knew a thing or two about God's infinitely giving heart of mercy. The self-proclaimed "chief of sinners" (I Tim. 1:15) declared that, in view of God's mercy, we ought to offer our lives as living sacrifices to God, and he went on to assert that this offering is our "reasonable," rational, non-exaggerated but a fully common sense act of worship (Rom. 12:1) On the top of God's wish-list is our whole hearts, our whole selves, given in whole and entire loyalty to Him (2 Chron. 16:9).

PARKING LOT RENOVATION

The Building and Grounds Committee has been working faithfully and diligently, along with the help of experts Crolie Lindsay and Dennis Bailey, in a special attempt to renovate our parking lot. Most recently, the committee met with Dennis Bailey on November 23. In view of the fact that the county offices have been slower than expected in granting us a permit to move forward with our plans, Mr. Bailey explained all the possible timelines and scenarios for actually getting started on the project.

Currently, the three factors that now influence the timing of the renovation are: 1) obtaining the permit from the county, 2) maximizing the usability of our facilities during construction, and 3) minimizing expenses. While some would have liked construction to already be underway, none of us would have wanted to be stuck with a muddy mess and an unserviceable campus throughout the winter. The best possible scenario at this point is to begin underground work for drainage and electrical improvements through the existing asphalt in January 2016, which could potentially be followed up in March 2016 with a speedy process of gravel grinding, grading, and paving.

So what can we do now? **First**, your pray for unity and patience as we move forward in replacing the parking lot. **Second**, pray for God's timing in obtaining permits and starting work. **Last**, but not least, pray that we individually will respond to God's promptings about what we can pledge and contribute financially to this project. We give praise to God for all that He has done and brought us through. Coming together, praying together, working together, we can succeed together. With God's help, we can do this.




Please remember to give to Sabbath School Expense regularly. We count on each one's contributions to continue providing supplies, such as:

What is Church Investment #1

First of all, I'd like to thank everyone who has been filling out the investment cards with their money and turning them in during the last few months. For those who haven't turned them in yet, please continue to fill the cards with money you've been earning, and turn them in as soon as you can – hopefully before the end of this year.

Many of you, especially our new members, have been asking me, "What does the investment money go to?" Investment offerings have been around for many years. We have had investment leaders in the past, who have not been able to get our church involved with investment projects.

Investment is a partnership with God – one that never fails! It might be briefly defined as a plan to invest our human resources of money, materials, time, and talents in a faith venture with God, praying and expecting that He will add divine power and blessings to ensure an increase for the benefit of His world-wide gospel work.

The investors carefully and prayerfully choose a plan. They then invite God's participation as a business partner. Heaven's blessings on human effort brings results that at times are nothing less than miraculous – as many happy and surprised investors can testify.

All "Investment Funds" go for special projects which are selected by each of the world division committees. Ten percent is allocated to projects in the North American Division; 90% is divided among the other divisions, prorated according to their needs.

The divisions are to use these special funds for projects that open up new work (frontier evangelism) or for large city evangelism.

The 75% of Investment not used for special projects is added to the World Mission Fund, which is divided among all the divisions to be used at the direction of the division committees.

Every six converts won through the use of Sabbath School offerings could be credited to the "Investment Fund"

Add the cacao powder last and blend again. The mixture is thick.
