Pastor's Corner

"I thank my God every time I remember you."

(Philippians 1:3, NIV)

It's hard to believe that this is the last I'll get to write for the Echoes. It's even harder to actually articulate all my heart longs to share with a church that has become my family's family. And so, please allow me to take my cues from one of Paul's letters to a church that had become his family.

Philippians 1:3-6 — "I thank my God every time I remember you. In all my prayers for all of you, I always pray with joy because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now, being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus." Parkwood, know that you have been prayed for and will continue to be prayed for. My heart is filled with gratitude and joy over the privilege of having partnered with you in ministry over the last three years, and I am convinced that whatever good has begun during that time will surely continue and grow until Jesus' return.

Philippians 1:27 — "Whatever happens, conduct yourselves in a manner worthy of the gospel of Christ. Philippians 3:13-14 — "...But one thing I do: Forgetting what is behind and straining toward what is ahead, I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus." I pray that we all, individually and as a community, would keep moving forward, onward, and heavenward. There's nothing wrong with cherishing positive memories of the past. But when it comes to the old life of sin or dynamics that we as a community of faith have worked and prayed to overcome, let's keep moving forward!

Philippians 4:6-7 — "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." If you're finding yourself anxious about what the future holds for Parkwood, keep praying to the God who gives us peace that passes all understanding. He got Parkwood here in answer to prayer, and He'll keep moving the church forward in answer to prayer. It wasn't any one person...it was prayer. So keep pressing together to pray with confidence that our God shall supply all our need according to His riches in glory (Phil. 4:19)!

Ana and Demeatrice Tolbert



Church Extras

Gluten Steaks Contributed by Dolly Willis

3 C gluten flour
1/2 C whole wheat flour
2 Tbsp nutritional food yeast flakes
1/2 tsp garlic powder
2 tsp beef-like seasoning
3 C water
2 Tbsp Bragg's liquid aminos

In a large bowl, combine all the dry ingredients. In a separate bowl, combine the water and the Bragg's. Add the liquids to the flour mixture, mixing it all quickly and thoroughly, as they will start to form your dough quickly. Don't mix it too long as it will

make your dough too rubbery. Roll into a long roll, with a 2 1/2" diameter. Slice the roll into 1/2" thick slices, pat them into circles, then add them to your boiling broth.

Broth

12 C water
2 Tbsp Vegex or veggie broth cubes
1 tsp onion powder
1 tsp garlic powder
1/4 C Bragg's liquid aminos

Bring broth to a boil. Add the steaks quickly. Bring the broth back to a boil and on a low fire, let the gluten boil for 1 hour. Remove the steaks from the

broth. Put them in the breading mixture then fry them till they are golden and crispy.

Breading Mixture

1 C whole wheat flour1/2 C seasoned bread crumbs1 Tbsp nutritional food yeast crumbs2 Tbsp wheat germ

Fry in a non-stick frying pan with olive oil.
Enjoy!
