



## Secret to Spiritual Success

- ❑ Daniel 6:10-11; Acts 5:28-29; 4:12-13—Sometimes our commitment to remain loyal to God and His commandments requires us to go \_\_\_\_\_ the flow of man's requirements and expectations.

Both Daniel and the disciples of Jesus serve as examples of people who stood true to God's Word and God's commandments over the word and commandments of men. It is significant to note that in both stories, these men were distinguished by the \_\_\_\_\_ they spent in the presence of God.

- ❑ Mark 1:35-38—The time Jesus spent alone with His Father in prayer and heart communion empowered Him to live a life of faithfulness to God's will and Word even when it went against other people's expectations.

## Necessity or Nicety?

- ❑ Luke 10:38-42—According to Jesus, the one thing we need is to spend intentionally invested time sitting at Jesus' \_\_\_\_\_, listening to Jesus' \_\_\_\_\_.
- ❑ Absolute necessity: Matthew 4:4; Job 23:12—God's Word is even more essential for life than our physical food. (cf. John 6:63)
- ❑ Daily necessity: Exodus 16:21 (cf. Matt. 6:11)—Just as God provides physical food for His people on a daily basis, He wants to give us the spiritual food of His Word every \_\_\_\_\_.



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## The Living Word

- Heb. 4:12—More than just ink on paper, the Word of God is living and powerful, impacting the very core of who we are.
- 1 Thes. 2:13; John 17:17—Unlike the word of men, the Bible does a sanctifying work within us, changing us from the inside out.
- 2 Corinthians 3:18 (Ex. 34:29)—The more we spend time fixing our eyes on the character of God in personal Bible study, the more we will be transformed into the same. By \_\_\_\_\_, we become changed.

## Getting Practical

- Principle #1: \_\_\_\_\_ is everything. (Ezra 7:10)
  - preparation of the \_\_\_\_\_ to hold nothing back from God
  - openness to being \_\_\_\_\_, \_\_\_\_\_, and \_\_\_\_\_ by God through His Holy Spirit (cf. Isa. 50:4; John 16:12)

  - “What?”—questions on the level of observation.
  - “So What?”—questions on the level of interpretation.
  - “Now What?”—questions on the level of application (Mt. 7:24-27).
